SECTION A LITERATURE: 'Mao's Last Dancer' – Li Cunxin

QUESTION 1 PARAGRAPH ON CHARACTER

Ben had made our stay such a positive experience and was proud to have arranged for the first two Chinese cultural exchange students to come to America. He'd been thoughtful and generous, protective and kind.

While Li and Zhang stayed with Ben Stevenson in Houston, they were overwhelmed by his kindness and generosity. Nothing was too much effort for Ben in his quest to be the perfect host to the two Chinese students.

Write a **paragraph** in which you discuss **Ben Stevenson's** role as Li and Zhang's **mentor** and **the different aspects of** the American way of life to which he introduces them.

Your paragraph should be approximately **180 words** in length and should contain at least **13 facts** from Li's autobiography.

Please provide a word count in brackets at the end of your paragraph.

QUESTION 2 PERSONAL RESPONSE

"Ohh ... Li!" Ben started to sob. "I've lost everything! Consul Zhang thinks I've masterminded this whole thing. They think it's all my fault. You've ruined everything! I'll never be allowed back into China now!"

Li's decision to marry Elizabeth and to stay in America can be regarded as a selfish one as it could have serious consequences for Ben's career as well as for Li's own family. It may, furthermore, interfere with the diplomatic relationship between America and China.

Write a **paragraph** of approximately **180 words** in which you provide your **personal opinion** as to whether Li's decision was justified, or whether he acted irresponsibly and selfishly. Although your answer has to be a personal opinion, you must refer to specific instances from the autobiography in order to support your viewpoint. You will receive marks for the validity and strength of your argument, as well as for the facts from the autobiography you use to back up your opinion. Provide **at least 10 relevant facts** from *Mao's Last Dancer*.

Please provide a word count in brackets at the end of your paragraph.

QUESTION 3 DIALOGUE

You must provide **at least 8 facts** from '*Mao's Last Dancer*'. You will also be awarded marks for the correct format.



- You will be penalised if your essay is obviously too long.
