QUESTION 1

SHAKESPEARE: ANTONY AND CLEOPATRA

THIS QUESTION IS COMPULSORY

Study the quote by Mary Rosenberg below and then write a mini-essay in response to the topic that follows:

"Antony and Cleopatra come from, and partly represent, the **different values** of two very different backgrounds and cultures: **Rome and Egypt**. The miracle of their love, is that it **unites this divided world**, but results in **sacrifices and conflict** – Antony and Cleopatra are inevitable **victims** of this conflict."

TOPIC:

- Your knowledge of Shakespeare's text, *Antony and Cleopatra,* and your ability to structure and substantiate your stance in order to develop a **tightly constructed argument** will be assessed.
- Close and relevant reference to the play is essential.
- Please be aware that you will be penalised should your essay be longer than 500 words.
- Please provide an accurate word count at the end of your essay.

- Do **NOT** provide a word count at the end of your essay.

One-way trip into the unknown for SA woman

Some would call Dr Adriana Marais crazy for wanting to be part of what could be a one-way trip to Mars but she believes it is worth the sacrifice.

Marais, who grew up in Pietermaritzburg and attended St John's DSG, said for her the allure of the unknown has always been far more powerful than the comfort of the known.

"Since early childhood I have imagined that if I were offered the opportunity to go into space on a spaceship to see what was there, further than we've been before, knowing that I wouldn't come back, I would go. Just to see what was there," she said.

Marais is one of six Africans who are candidates for the Mars One programme. The Netherlandsbased programme's objective is to establish a human settlement on the Red Planet.

Mars is the only planet that is currently thought to possibly be able to support human life and the programme will be humankind's first step to become a multi-planetary species.

"I believe that finding evidence of life on Mars would be one of the most important possible discoveries for humanity – a giant leap forward in terms of understanding who we are and where we come from."

"I would be prepared to sacrifice my life on Earth for this idea, this adventure, this achievement, that would not be my own, but that of all humanity," said Marais.
